Green Frog (Rana clamitans)
The green frog is widespread throughout eastern
North
America.
This species

is a

generalist and will live in ponds, swamps, springs, and brooks. Green frogs breed anywhere from March to August depending on their location. The very distinctive call of the green frog sounds like a plucking banjo string..."C-tung." This frog may already be calling in the southern part of the United States. Has anyone heard it yet?
